OVERVIEW

The Climate Ambition Support Alliance (CASA) Phase 2 is a £9.5m UK Department for Energy Security and Net Zero funded programme implemented by DAI Global UK Ltd. The programme increases the capacity and capability of climatevulnerable country negotiators to engage in international climate negotiations.

The CASA programme is an important support mechanism for many climatevulnerable country parties that are adopting the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). It supports their ability to access, participate in, and influence climate negotiations through several negotiation groups, such as the Association of Small Island States (AOSIS), Least Developed Countries (LDC), and the High Ambition Coalition (HAC).



TECHNICAL DELIVERY

CASA2 is a multi-layered programme composed of several different partners with varied areas of technical expertise. Through these technical partners (TPs), CASA2 will support Chairs of selected negotiation groups to deliver workplans for their terms, **UNFCCC**-adopted work programmes, and the groups' longer-term visions and strategies.
